- SF pointed out that Governors get considerably more data than most schools.
 - DL acknowledged that Governors get a lot of data but added the importance of Governors being able to understand it.

2	 This data is also used with Teachers. Classroom Monitor have translated Baseline Data to Classroom Monitor. SF added that this still needs some fine tuning. SF reminded Governors that we do not just look at raw data, but also
	 books. Overall we are looking for 3 or 4 points of progress per annum. The figures in brackets in columns 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12 and 14 are the average points that the children have scored. Overall the children are doing well.
3	 No progress data is available as we are unable to translate from EYFS. DL asked that in future reports an explanation of 1Beg+, 1Dev etc is provided.
4	 The emphasis in the new curriculum is on numbers. SF pointed out that the new scheme which we purchased is very number heavy. To be covered in staff training / INSET. SF stressed the importance of getting the balance right between numbers and maths. The book looks are showing phenomenal progress in Maths. The expected progress average is 1.5.
