

Mission Statement

At North Ealing School, we intend to deliver the best possible service to the pupils and parents. We wish to serve our local community and establish a positive, safe, clean, sustainable, challenging and inclusive environment where everyone involved with the school can flourish. North Ealing is a 'values based learning community' committed to the education of the whole child. In addition to our value based approach underpinning all aspects of school life we have an inclusive approach to the different faiths and cultures represented in our community.

As a primary school at the heart of the community we encourage independence in the young people we support; we put the highest priority on communicating and including our parents; we aim to maximise the school's resources; we plan carefully for the future so we are able to maintain the ethos and standards presently associated with the school; we regularly review our progress. Finally, amongst the staff, we foster a sense of ownership and working as a team.

All employees are entitled to a continuous programme of training and development so they can provide the best standards for pupils. We see ourselves as a learning school. This means a continuous and demanding agenda of improvements so that we know what changes are needed in order to improve.

To drive these improvements, we have performance management targets covering many aspects of our operations. They are set by the Senior Leadership team and are included in our School Improvement Plan. The governing body agrees the targets.

Starting at North Ealing

We arrange school tours throughout the school year and also specific tours for the Early Years; these are advertised on the school website. At a mutually convenient time, we are always willing to do a tour of the school for other parents/carers. We have a variety of meetings in the summer term for the parent/carers of Reception and Nursery children.

Our intention is to make all parents feel welcome at all times and help children settle well into North Ealing.

The feedback of parents, pupils, staff and governors is vital to our development. Several of our governors are also parents, as are members of our staff. The PTA is highly successful and works closely with the school. We aim to be open and friendly and take account of constructive criticism. We also distribute questionnaires to parents, pupils, governors and staff regularly. The information gained from these adds to our self-evaluation and school development plan.

Parent Participation

We invite parents/carers to visit their class teacher at least once each term. Early in the autumn term we have a Meet the Teacher evening. We wish to keep parents informed as to their child's progress. An annual report on progress and attainment is written in the summer term. The Senior Team, Teachers and support staff will always make time before or after school by appointment to discuss any issues which may have arisen. We believe communication and partnership are at the heart of what we offer at North Ealing.

A newsletter is published monthly online and emailed directly to all parent/carers. We publish a list of key dates on our website within the first two weeks of each term. We also endeavour to keep parents regularly updated via text message and daily bulletins.
